Locating the burn site at the center, identify all occupied residences that are located within one mile of the burn site.

## A VARIANCE APPROVAL TO OPEN BURN IS SUBJECT TO THE FOLLOWING:

- Oil, rubber, asphalt, asphalt shingles, upholstered furniture, plastics, fabrics, insulation, foam, treated wood, electronics, appliances, household waste, hazardous materials, batteries, chemicals, and other materials which produce unreasonable amounts of air contaminants may not be burned.
- 2. Grass and leaves which smolder and do not burn readily shall not be burned. The material must be dry enough to burn cleanly and shall not contain noncombustible matter or items such as metal, glass, plaster, sheetrock, concrete, brick etc.
- 3. Care must be used to minimize the amount of dirt on the material being burned.
- 4. The initial burning may begin only between three hours after sunrise and three hours before sunset, and additional fuel may not be intentionally added to the fire at times outside those limits.
- 5. The burning must be conducted in such a manner to ensure that the fire will not spread to any material not approved for burning.
- 6. Prevailing winds at the time of burning at the above location must be away from any nearby city or occupied residence and must be away from any airport or landing strip within one mile (1.61 kilometers).
- 7. The burning may not be conducted adjacent to any highway or public road so as to create a traffic hazard.
- 8. The burning may not be conducted in such proximity to any Class I area that the visibility of such area is adversely impacted, as defined in Chapter 33.1-15-19 of the North Dakota Air Pollution Control Rules.
- 9. The local/appropriate fire department must be notified at least two (2) hours prior to burning.
- 10. Notification to the Department is required prior to starting the burn.
- 11. Burning activities must be attended and supervised at all times burning is in progress.
- 12. Burning is prohibited if the fire index is in the "extreme" category as issued by the National Weather Service.
- 13. If state or local fire officials determine conditions to be unsafe for open burning, such burning must cease until conditions are deemed to be safe by such officials.
- 14. The variance must be utilized within sixty (60) days of the Department approval date.
