



Minutes: 82nd Annual Meeting of the North Dakota Water and Pollution Control Conference

The 82nd Annual Meeting of the North Dakota Water and Pollution Control Conference (NDWPCC) was held October 12, 13, and 14, 2010 at the Holiday Inn, Fargo, North Dakota. The Annual Meeting/Convention was held jointly with the North Dakota Chapter of the American Public Works Association (NDCAPWA), the North Dakota Water Environment Association (NDWEA), and the North Dakota Section of the American Water Works Association (NDAWWA).

The NDAWWA Education and Research Committee held a pre-conference meeting at 7:30 p.m. on Monday, October 11, 2010 in the Frontier Room of the Holiday Inn.

Board meetings were held Tuesday, October 12, 2010 by NDAWWA at 7:30 a.m. in the Frontier Room, NDCAPWA at 8:00 a.m. in the Embassy A Room, and NDWEA at 8:00 a.m. in the Embassy B Room. Additional NDAWWA committee meetings were held at 10:30 a.m. in the Frontier Room following the 9:30 a.m. joint board meeting. During the board meetings, the associations planned their business luncheons, heard committee reports, accepted volunteers for committees, and conducted other business as needed. Association business meetings were held Tuesday, October 12 (NDCAPWA); Wednesday, October 13 (NDAWWA); and Thursday, October 14 (NDWEA and NDWPCC).

North Dakota operator certification exams were written Tuesday, October 12, 2010 from 7:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. in the Mezzanine I and II Suites, with 16 operators taking 22 exams. Registration opened at 8:00 a.m. on Tuesday, October 12, with Patty Carman and Darlene Germain welcoming all attendees. A total of 352 pre-registered, with final attendance reaching 390.

The joint board of directors of the NDWPCC, NDWEA, NDCAPWA, and NDAWWA met at 9:30 a.m. Tuesday, October 12 in the Frontier Room with NDWPCC President Miranda Kleven presiding. President Kleven called the meeting to order at 9:36 a.m., and while attendance rosters were being circulated she welcomed Cordell Samuels from the Water Environment Federation (WEF) on behalf of the joint boards. The following board members and guests were in attendance: Chuck Abel, Lisa Ansley, Terry Boehm, Gary Bracht, Mike Brisben, David Bruschwein, Bill Gefroh, Rick Gillund, Dan Jonasson, Miranda Kleven, Steve Lagro, Wei Lin, Jack Long, Seth Lynne, Lance Meyer, Karla Olson, Tim Paustian, Meredith Quinn, Rusten Roteliuk, Cordell Samuels, Darin Schaeffer, Dean Sletten, Shawn Soehren, Larry Thelen, Tom Welle, and Chad Zander.

President Kleven entertained a motion to dispense with reading of the minutes from the May 26, 2010 joint board meeting at the Seven Seas Hotel in Mandan and approve the copy mailed to each board member or those published in the conference issue of the *Official Bulletin*. Bill Gefroh so moved. Dean Sletten seconded, and the motion carried.

Mike Brisben presented the January 1, 2010 - August 31, 2010 NDWPCC treasurer's report, listing a net loss of \$7,049.19 and total assets of \$70,870.71. Seth Lynne moved to accept the treasurer's report as presented. Chuck Abel seconded, and the motion carried.

Moving to old business, President Kleven called for a report on the PayPal payment option for the 2010 conference. Mr. Brisben reported that 15 transactions totaling \$5,240 were received, with \$156.46 going to PayPal for transaction fees, resulting in a net deposit of \$5,083.54. Mr. Brisben noted that the transactions consisted of 35 package registrations and two tabletop program registrations. President Kleven next called for a report on the student/young professionals reception. Dr. Wei Lin reported that a separate room had been reserved at Buffalo Wild Wings and that a good crowd was expected. Dr. Lin also shared that he expected up to 30 students to attend the concurrent sessions. Meredith Quinn reported that a group from the University of North Dakota would also be attending.

President Kleven called for any other old business. Hearing none, President Kleven asked for volunteers for the NDWPCC officer nominating committee. Lisa Ansley asked how many positions needed to be filled. Mr. Brisben noted that one incoming director and the associate director position were needed. Ms. Ansley, Bill Gefroh, and Dean Sletten agreed to serve on the committee. Next, President Kleven requested volunteers for the auditing committee. Ms. Ansley, Mr. Gefroh, and Jack Long agreed to meet in Bismarck after the conference.

Continuing with new business, President Kleven asked for a report on conference activities. Mr. Brisben reviewed activities for the 82nd meeting, which included the golf tournament, a student/young professional reception, three concurrent sessions, and tours of the Fargo Effluent Reuse Facility and Lift Stations 60 and 61. President Kleven reminded board members to start thinking of topics for the 2011 spring operator training sessions and the fall conference in Bismarck.

President Kleven requested nominations for life membership to be voted on at the Thursday, October 14 business meeting. Next, Mr. Brisben requested permission to upgrade the InDesign Software used to print the *Official Bulletin*. Mr. Gefroh asked what was currently being used. Mr. Brisben indicated the current software (2nd edition) used Windows 2003 and that the upgrade would be to the 5th edition. Mr. Gefroh noted that the city of Bismarck was converting to Windows 2010. David Bruschwein indicated that the NDDH was currently using Windows 2007. Further discussion ensued with Tom Welle making a motion to purchase the upgrade. Meredith Quinn seconded, and the motion carried. Mr. Brisben indicated that the upgrade would be purchased in 2011.

President Kleven called for any other new business. Hearing none, President Kleven called for a motion to adjourn. Karla Olson so moved. Meredith Quinn seconded, and the meeting adjourned at 9:56 a.m.

Water samples for the 19th annual water taste test, sponsored by NDAWWA, were accepted throughout the day Tuesday.

The Tuesday luncheon and NDCAPWA business meeting were held in the Sterling and Crowne Rooms of the Great Hall with NDCAPWA President Darin Schaeffer presiding. NDWEA President Skip Rapp welcomed all attendees on behalf of the joint board of directors and Mayor Dennis Walaker welcomed all on behalf of the city of Fargo.

The annual golf tournament teed off at 1:00 p.m. at the Moorhead Country Club with Tom Welle and Karla Olson handling local arrangements.




Jeff Hauge's retirement, September 30, 2010 left the division the challenge of filling some big shoes to continue the work and success of the CWSRF Program.

Drinking Water Operator Expense Reimbursement Grant Ending

Funded by a grant from EPA, the North Dakota Water Operator Reimbursement Program provides funding for certifying and training for operators of small public drinking water systems. This was a one-time grant allocated to help small water systems with operator training expenses. Unfortunately, this grant is coming to an end. We are predicting that the funding for this grant will run out during the summer of 2011. Therefore, we are encouraging those who rely on the funds from this program to attend training sessions for Continuing Education Credits (CECs) or certification before the funds are spent. Requests for reimbursement must be submitted in a timely manner because requests are approved on a first-come first-serve basis.

All small community water systems (CWSs) and non-transient non-community systems (NTNCs) serving 3,300 or fewer persons are eligible for reimbursement for certification and training costs.

Basically, the program works as follows: operators or system owners must initially pay for their training costs and then request reimbursement using forms provided by the Department of Health. Eligible costs and reimbursement amounts are outlined in the Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ's) section below.

FAQ's about the Drinking Water System Operator Reimbursement Program

Who is eligible for reimbursement?

Drinking water operators of CWSs and NTNCs serving 3,300 or fewer persons are eligible for certification and training reimbursement. (Wastewater training costs are not eligible for reimbursement under this program).

What expenses are eligible for reimbursement?

- Certification and renewal fees: Initial certification and subsequent annual certification renewal fees of \$5 are reimbursable.
- Operator training cost needed to complete the required 12 (CEUs) that operators must earn to maintain their certification: Training costs include the cost of registration fees, manuals, and/or study guides.

- Vehicle Miles: Mileage is limited to one vehicle per system and one round trip per event at the current federal mileage rate. Car pooling is required.
- Lodging and Meals: Per diem rates are eligible at state rates. Reimbursement is only allowed if meals are not furnished. For a breakdown of costs for breakfast, lunch, and dinner see: http://www.ndhealth.gov/MF/Forms/Operator_Reimbursement_Form.pdf
- Exam Fees: When an operator takes an operator exam, there is a \$10 fee.

Mapping Ground Water Rule Requirements: Triggered and Additional Source Water Monitoring

Consecutive System:

A public water system that

receives some or all of its finished

water from one or more wholesale

This is the second article in a series of five articles developed by U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), Office of Ground Water and Drinking Water (OGWDW), that summarize key components of the Ground Water Rule (GWR). The first article was printed in the Spring 2010 *Official Bulletin* (Vol. 96, Nos. 1-6, pg 29). As with all drinking water rules, please check with the North Dakota Department of Health for specific, state-related requirements.

The GWR has four basic requirements: **Source Water Monitoring**, Compliance Monitoring, Sanitary Surveys,

and Corrective Action. The previous article introduced some of the key elements of the rule and provided a glimpse into future articles detailing components of the GWR. This article discusses in further detail the source water monitoring component. As seen in Figure 1, triggered and additional source

water monitoring applies to those ground water systems (GWSs) that do not reliably provide 4-log treatment of viruses, which includes inactivation/removal or a state-approved combination of these technologies before or at the first customer. These systems may have to conduct source water monitoring (Figure 1) to comply with the GWR in the event of a total coliform-positive (TC+) sample collected in their distribution systems. Source

water monitoring is comprised of triggered and/or additional monitoring (discussed in this article) and assessment monitoring (discussed in the next article).

Triggered Source Water Monitoring

GWSs that do not provide at least 4-log treatment of viruses and are notified of a routine TC+ sample collected under the Total Coliform Rule (TCR) must conduct triggered source water monitoring. Triggered source water monitoring includes the collection and analysis of samples for fecal indicators and helps determine if fecal contamination is present in the ground

water source.

Within 24 hours of being notified of a routine TC+ sample, the GWS must collect one ground water sample for each TC+ from each source in use when the routine TC+ sample was collected. The sample must be collected prior to treatment or at a state-approved location. Some GWSs might have to

install a tap prior to treatment in order to collect this sample if one is not already in place. Both triggered and additional source water monitoring sample volumes must be at least 100 milliliters (ml). For systems that serve less than 1,000 people, the GWR allows the system, with state approval, to use the triggered source water sample to meet both TCR and GWR requirements, as long as the state has approved the use of E.coli as a fecal indicator for source water monitoring under both the TCR and GWR.

The GWR allows for representative sampling for those GWSs that have multiple sources. Instead of collecting a triggered source water sample per source in use at the time the routine TC+ was collected, the state may allow a GWS with multiple sources to sample from a groundwater source that is representative of the aquifer and of the monitoring sites in the system's state-approved TCR sample plan. The representative sample locations must be approved by the state. When conducting representative monitoring, systems must still collect the sample within 24 hours of being notified of the routine TC+ sample and analyze the sample using an approved method (see Table 1). Representative sampling may be beneficial for some systems since it reduces the monitoring cost burden. The rule authorizes the state to require a triggered source water monitoring plan if the GWS will be conducting representative monitoring.




Figure 2. GWR Triggered Source Water Monitoring Requirements for Consecutive and Wholesale Systems

The GWR has specific requirements for triggered source water monitoring conducted by wholesale and consecutive systems as shown in Figure 2.

In the event that a wholesale system that does not provide 4-log treatment of viruses at all of its groundwater sources is notified by a consecutive system of a routine

TC+ sample collected under TCR, the wholesale system must sample each groundwater source in operation at the time the TC+ was collected and analyze those sources for the state-specified fecal indicator within 24 hours of being notified of the TC+ sample. If this subsequent sample is fecal indicator-positive (FI+), the wholesale system must notify all

consecutive systems served by the FI+ source and take the state-approved corrective action. In turn, both the wholesale and the consecutive systems that delivered finished water from the FI+ ground water source must notify their consumers under the Tier 1 Public Notification (PN) requirements and via Special Notice in the Consumer Confidence Report, both of which are described in more detail in the fifth article of this series.




Figure 3. GWR Requirements for FI+ Triggered Source Water Monitoring Samples

Additional Source Water Monitoring

If a triggered source water monitoring sample is FI+, the system must conduct additional source water monitoring unless the state requires corrective action. Figure 3 above provides a graphical representation of these requirements. If the state invalidates a FI+ sample, the system must collect a new sample for the same fecal indicator. To comply with the additional source water monitoring requirement, the system must collect five additional source water samples within 24 hours of learning of the FI+ triggered source water sample, unless the state requires corrective action or if the sample is invalidated by the state. The samples must be collected from the same ground water source where the original triggered source water monitoring sample was collected that had a FI+ source water sample. The GWS should ask the state for the frequency at which it must collect the additional source water monitoring samples during the 24-hour period as well. If one of the additional source

water samples is FI+, the GWS is required to conduct corrective action as discussed in the rule. Corrective action is discussed in the fourth article of this series.

Methods

Samples must be analyzed using methods approved under the GWR.

Table 1 identifies the approved methods.

Answer 1. No. The federal rule does not state that the additional source water monitoring sample be analyzed for the same fecal indicator used for triggered source water monitoring. This would be a state-specific requirement. Please check with your state to ensure you analyze the sample for the correct fecal indicator.

Question 2. If any of the GWS's repeat TCR samples are TC+, does the GWS have to take more triggered source water monitoring samples?

Answer 2. No. The GWS is only required to conduct triggered source water monitoring in response to a TCR routine sample result that is TC+. However, the state may require the GWS to conduct assessment monitoring if it believes that the source might be vulnerable to contamination.

Question 3. Is an FI+ triggered source water sample a treatment technique violation?

Answer 3. No. An FI+ triggered source water sample requires either corrective action or additional monitoring as determined by the state. It also requires Tier 1 PN, Special Notice in the Consumer Confidence Report, and notification to any consecutive system that could have

received water from the FI+ source. Under the GWR, the system will only receive a treatment technique violation if it fails to meet the corrective action requirement, provide treatment, or maintain microbial treatment.

Training Opportunities

Currently, EPA Headquarters has not scheduled any additional workshops or webcast trainings on the GWR; however, there still may be trainings sponsored by your state, EPA Region, or technical assistance providers. Contact your EPA Region or state for more information on workshops or trainings that may be held near you. 

NDWEA 51st Annual Meeting Minutes

The North Dakota Water Environment Association (NDWEA) held its annual business meeting on Thursday October 14, 2010 at the Holiday Inn in Fargo, North Dakota. Skip Rapp called the meeting to order; 157 people were present at the 11:30 a.m. business luncheon.

The minutes for last year's meeting were published in the *Official Bulletin*. President Rapp asked if there were any objections to dispensing with the reading of the minutes. There were no objections. Keith Demke moved that the minutes be approved as published. Mark Blonigen seconded the motion. There was no further discussion, and the motion passed.

Bill Gefroh was called upon by President Rapp to present the Secretary-Treasurer's report. As of August 31, 2010, the association has a general fund balance of \$4,940.78. Last year on September 3, 2009, the balance was \$5,262.33, a decrease of \$321.55 from the previous year. NDWEA membership is at 143, compared to 154 at this time last year. Mel Bullinger made a motion to approve the Treasurer's report. Dan Stephan seconded, and the motion passed.

The majority of the NDWEA budget expenditures are aimed at providing water/wastewater educational support and related activities in North Dakota. In 2010, the NDWEA contributed monetary support to:

- The North Dakota State Science Fair. Two checks for \$75 were provided: one each for the junior and senior divisions for outstanding water quality projects, NDWEA also contributed \$813.60 for the cost of the airline tickets for Patrick Gulan and his teacher Marcus Friskop from Hankinson High School to participate at the national Stockholm Junior Water Prize Competition in St. Louis, Mo.
- 2. The Student Chapters at the North Dakota State University in Fargo and the University of North Dakota in Grand Fords. A total of \$500 was contributed to the activities fund to help with expenses associated with their participation in the student design competition at the Water Environment Federation (WEF) Technical Exhibition and Conference that was held in New Orleans, La. in 2010.
- 3. The Gateway to Science Center in Bismarck, Environmental Festival, \$500
- 4. The River Keepers in Fargo, Environmental Festival, \$500
- 5. Drinking water week advertisement, \$482.43
- 6. Water/Wastewater Agency Response Network, webpage, \$350

- 7. Keep North Dakota Clean, poster contest, \$100
- 8. The Water Environment Research Foundation, \$100

Awards that were sponsored by or through the NDWEA in 2010 included two high school awards (one each for the junior and senior divisions for outstanding water quality projects at the North Dakota State Science and Engineering Fair), the WEF Burke Safety Award, the NDWEA President Service Award, and one WEF Life Membership Award.

President Rapp introduced the guest speaker, Mr. Cordell Samuels, WEF Board of Trustees member. He is the current Plant Superintendent at the Duffin Creek Water Pollution Control Plant in Ontario, Canada. Mr. Samuels talked about WEFTEC, WEF, and how WEF is trying to modernize its image, realign its website, and make changes to meet future challenges. He encouraged people at the luncheon to get involved and respond to WEF initiatives, to attend WEFTEC, and to be a part of the water and wastewater solutions our communities benefit from.

Old Business:

Approval of the NDWEA Constitution and Bylaws proposed changes as emailed out to NDWEA members, including: add two additional past presidents to the executive committee; adopt the recommended changes as suggested by the WEF Constitution and Bylaws review committee, change the director designation to delegate, change the Board of Control designation to House of Delegates, change the Professional Wastewater Operations Division Regional Council designation to Professional Wastewater Operations representative, allow delegates to be reappointed in accordance with the WEF Constitution and Bylaws, adopt the new membership language as developed/adopted by WEF, remove the review of the WEF applications by the Secretary-Treasurer for approval as a WEF member, and change the WEF Regional Meeting designation to WEFMAX (Water Environment Federation Member Association Exchange). Pete Bilstad made a motion to approve the NDWEA Constitution and Bylaws changes, Rick Gillund seconded it, and the motion passed.









ND Chapter APWA Announces 2010 Project of the Year Award Winners

Project of the Year awards were presented at the 2010 North Dakota Water and Pollution Control Conference in Fargo by the North Dakota Chapter of the American Public Works Association (APWA). The awards are presented in two categories: large community (serving populations greater than 5000) and small community (serving populations less than 5000). Eligible public works projects are defined as the physical structures and facilities that are developed, owned and maintained by public agencies to provide water, power, waste disposal, transportation and similar public services. Project selection criteria included construction techniques, safety issues, community relations, environmental protection, unique accomplishments, public benefit and other similar criteria.

Large Community Winner - Northwest Area Water Supply; Engineer: Houston Engineering, Inc.

The goal of the Northwest Area Water Supply (NAWS) project is to bring Lake Sakakawea water to Minot for treatment and distribution to approximately 60,000 people in north central North Dakota. The entire NAWS project is subject to environmental conditions agreed to as part of the Environmental Assessment process that preceded initial construction in 2002. These conditions identify and stress communication and coordination with many state and federal agencies to limit project-related impacts to historical sites, sensitive environmental areas, wetlands, wildlife, endangered species and the environment in general. An annual site visit was required to evaluate construction techniques and ensure compliance with the environmental conditions. In spite of an injunction, the

court allowed the North Dakota State Water Commission to proceed with design and construction of project elements that do not affect any potential treatment options south of the continental divide. This project included a new, 2-million-gallon reinforced concrete reservoir, pump station building, pumps for the NAWS distribution system (high pressure side) and the city of Minot Valley Zone (low pressure side), new backwash pumps in the Minot water treatment plant, a 42-inch diameter pipeline to connect the existing clearwell at the Minot water treatment plant (MWTP) to the newly finished water reservoir and high service pump station facility (FWR/HSPS), standby power, integration with the security system, site piping and a collection system. Due to site constraints and impacts to future NAWS elements, the new FWR/HSPS was ultimately located on a city-owned lot across 16th Street SW from the MWTP.

Small Community Winner - City of Cavalier System Improvements; Engineer: AE2S, Inc.

Two of the lift stations belonging to the city of Cavalier were not keeping up with the flow of the wastewater pipeline and were causing backups and raw sewage to overflow into the river. The challenge of the project was that the lift stations were built deep into the earth and were located right up against homes. AE2S developed strong working relationships with homeowners to navigate through the project as well as with funding agencies to secure adequate funds for the repair. The AE2S team completed a preliminary engineering report to secure funding, worked with hydraulic modeling systems, acquired funding to complete the repair and designed a cost-efficient and successful solution for the city of Cavalier's lift station upgrade.





Minutes of the Spring Board of Trustees Meeting North Dakota Section of the American Water Works Association

The Fall Board Meeting of Trustees was held at the Holiday Inn in Fargo, ND on October 12, 2010. Present at the meeting were Greg Wavra, Dean Sletten, Tim Paustian, Nancy Huether, David Bruschwein, Duane Friesz, Jason Sorenson, Eric Volk, Larry Thelen, Hazel Sletten, John Donahue, Jack Long, Lisa Ansley, Meredith Quinn, Sarah Volk, Chad Miller, and Dennis Larson.

The meeting was called to order by North Dakota AWWA (NDAWWA) President, Duane Friesz at 7:35 a.m. To begin the meeting, Lisa Ansley introduced AWWA Vice-President John Donahue.

Secretary's Report

After brief introductions were made, Chad Miller gave the Secretary's Report. The report required the dispensing and approval of the minutes from the spring meeting held in May of 2010. Tim Paustian made a motion for approval. Jason Sorenson seconded, and the motion passed.

Treasurer's Report

Next, Greg Wavra gave the Treasurer's Report. Mr. Wavra stated that NDAWWA has a total of \$31,853.91 in cash and in bank accounts. He noted that NDAWWA has more than \$90,000 in reserves and scholarship endowments and \$111,853.91 in total assets. Mr. Wavra also stated that the overhead at the time was approximately \$1000 depending on the expenses for past student trips. Mr. Paustian inquired about the profits NDAWWA would receive from the 2010 North Dakota Pollution and Control Conference. Mr. Wavra stated he would estimate \$1900. Lisa Ansley led some discussion on the future reimbursements for the University of North Dakota students in addition to the North Dakota State University students. Ms. Ansley motioned to approve the Treasurer's Report. Mr. Paustian seconded and the motion carried.

Education and Research

Meredith Quinn gave the committee report and stated that Leslee Storlie won the university scholarship. Ms. Quinn also noted that NDSU sent eight students to WEFTECH, and UND sent three. She also stated that NDAWWA made over \$1900 for the Surface Water Workshop held earlier this year.

Mr. Paustian inquired about judges for the poster session held at the NDWPCC. Eric Volk, John Donahue, and Dean Sletten all volunteered to be judges. Mr. Donahue stated that he would review the format and requirements for the poster session. He also would like the winning poster to be published in the AWWA Journal and *Official Bulletin*, as well as getting the winner to ACE 2011.

Membership

Dean Sletten led the conversation on membership. He stated that NDAWWA currently has 266 members. The section usually has, on average, 254. He noted that the section is seeing an increase in student memberships; however, he is seeing a decline in the individual and utility memberships. He then discussed activities that AWWA is proposing to help increase membership.

Water for People

Hazel Sletten led the discussion on Water For People. She stated that golf sponsors for this year's golf tournament held during the NDWPCC Conference have already donated more than \$2800. NDAWWA alsowill be selling raffle tickets at \$5 each during the conference.

Public Relations Committee

Next, Sarah Volk spoke on behalf of the PR Committee. She said that the committee had met in May of 2010. The committee made updates to the awards given to operators, redesigned and purchased a new plaque for the "water taste test" contest, ordered 500 water bottles to be given out at the table top display session, and purchased a new retractable banner for the booth.

Water Utility Council

John Donahue led conversation on the water utility council. He made comments on the large number of attendees. He also mentioned the impact AWWA had at the recent "D.C. Fly-In." He noted that all 50 states were represented.

Director's Report

The director's report was given by Lisa Ansley. She stated that AWWA's major focus has been on membership and its value. She also made statements on the nominations and upcoming elections. She will be attending the winter board meeting for directors in San Antonio in January. Next, Mr. Donahue made comments on the current program analysis performed by AWWA. He stated that one-third of current AWWA programs are to be revamped or eliminated. This process will establish guidance on which of AWWA's current programs will need help or termination.

WARN

Mr. Wavra stated that NDAWWA gave \$350 for the establishment and creation of the new WARN website. He stated that it is now in use. He also stated during the past year 50 people have attended training for WARN. He then spoke on the legal issues with WARN agreements, North Dakota Century Code and indemnification.

New Items

Next, Chad Miller offered his resignation from the position of NDAWWA Secretary/Treasurer. He stated that he appreciated everybody's help through the past years. Mr. Volk motioned to accept Mr. Miller's resignation, and Ms. Ansley seconded. The motion passed.



Exercise Roughrider, February 2011

Exercise Roughrider is an emergency management exercise that is being sponsored by the North Dakota Department of Emergency Services in February 2011. This will be a regional exercise hosted in the following cities: Minot February 8, Dickinson February 10, Jamestown February 15 and Devils Lake on February 17.

The purpose of Exercise Roughrider is two-fold. First, it is a functional exercise to demonstrate North Dakota's Emergency Radio Communications Interoperability. Second, it is a tabletop exercise that will provide participants an opportunity to evaluate current response concepts, plans, and capabilities during a catastrophic event that requires a regional response. The tabletop portion of the exercise will focus on local command and control coordination, critical decisions, notifications, and the integration of state and federal assets necessary to

save lives and protect public health and safety. The role of public information strategies will be critical to the overall response effort.

The exercise guidelines state that this is an open, low-stress, no-fault environment. Varying viewpoints are expected. Responses are based on your knowledge of current plans and capabilities (i.e., you may use only existing assets) and insights derived from training. Issue identification is not as valuable as suggestions and recommended actions that could improve response and preparedness efforts. Problem-solving efforts will be the focus. Minutes of the Statewide ND Water/Wastewater Agency Response Network (ND WARN)

A statewide meeting of NDWARN was held October 5, 2010 at the North Dakota Department of Health located at 918 East Divide Avenue in Bismarck, N.D. The meeting was held in the basement video conference room. Video conferencing calls were made to sites located in the cities of Fargo, Dickinson and Grand Forks. Present in attendance at these sites were Statewide Committee Members: Vice Chair Joe LaFave, South Central Regional Water District; and Secretary Hazel Sletten, city of Grand Forks. State Chair Skip Rapp, city of Dickinson, was absent. Other committee members included: Mary Massad, Southwest Water Authority; Steve Ellefson, South Central Regional Water District; and Associate Members Andy McDonald, North Dakota Rural Water Systems Association; Andy Job, City of Grand Forks; and Greg Wavra and Bob Disney, North Dakota Department of Health. Visiting participants were Sean Fredricks, Legal Council Cass Rural Water District and Joshua Wolla, Rain For Rent.

The meeting was called to order at 1:30 p.m. by Joe LaFave, introductions were made and the agenda reviewed. Joe then read a letter of resignation from Skip Rapp. Skip thanked ND WARN for taking on the job of promoting statewide emergency preparedness and mutual aid for the water sector. He went on to state that he had retired from the city of Dickinson and felt that he was no longer in a position to continue as the ND WARN state chair. Skip also indicated that he would consider involvement with the group in another role.

Secretary's Report

Hazel Sletten presented a summary of the May 25, 2010 meeting. It was noted that the minutes from this meeting were published in the September, 2010 issue of the *Official Bulletin*.

Old Business

1. Website Development - the website is complete and can be viewed at ndwarn.org. Greg Wavra noted that all authorized member contact information has been entered with Member (System) Name, ID, Type of Membership and Authorized Contact with phone number(s). Greg has been working on the e-mail contact portion of the system to work out any glitches with communication before next spring. E-mails are sent from info@ndwarn.org, and members should check to make sure that they are not being blocked as junk mail by their own systems. Greg will have the ND WARN booth at the North Dakota Water and Pollution Control Conference in Fargo on October 13, 2010 and the 25th Annual Water Expo in Bismarck February 1-2, 2011. He will be available to assist

water systems with any issues they are encountering. Once you have your login information (user name and password set up by Greg), please check to make sure that the information regarding your system is correct. If your system has resources available for use in an emergency, you can begin to populate the system resources window.

2. Mutual Aid Revisions - During the last ND WARN statewide meeting, discussion involved changes that might be necessary to the Mutual Aid Agreement because of possible conflicts with the North Dakota Century Code concerning the issue of indemnification. Two courses of action to address this issue were discussed. The first course of action was a language change to the ND WARN Mutual Aid Agreement referencing current state law. A work group was assigned the task of trying to draft the new language. This group met in August to work on the wording. The group took the amended agreement back to its own legal council. Following the legal opinions of the attorneys who reviewed these changes, it became apparent that clarification on this issue would be needed. The North Dakota Century Code has specific language allowing municipalities to indemnify, but it is silent on the issue regarding rural water systems. The North Dakota Attorney General had previously issued a Letter of Opinion stating that political subdivisions only have the authorities granted them in the North Dakota Century Code.

Legislative action was the second course of action discussed. In September, Representative Dwight Wrangham met with ND WARN to discuss the possibility of changes to the North Dakota Century Code. These changes would allow all political subdivisions the ability to indemnify participating members of mutual aid agreements working in response to emergency services under Chapter 37-17.1 of the Century Code. This language has been drafted and is in the process of being reviewed.

3. NIMS/ICS Employee Training - Training for those who have not yet participated in this program is strongly encouraged. Joe LaFave noted that training for South Central Regional Water District was pursuing staff and board members. Mary Massad stated the employees from Southwest Water Authority were already trained. Greg Wavra noted the availability of online training for ICS 100/200 and NIMS 700/800 courses. Dickinson and Grand Forks both have local trainers for higher level NIMS courses available to them. ICS 300 and 400 level classes are

being held in Fargo and Minot this December. These are two-day courses sponsored by the North Dakota Department of Emergency Services. You are required to have completed the ICS 100/200 level classes first. Check their website http://www.nd.gov/des/events/.

- 4. Utility Development of Emergency Response Plans (ERPs)- It was noted that some of the smaller utilities still do not have plans developed and efforts need to continue to assist them with getting plans completed.
- Table Top Exercise Planning provided by EPA An After Action Report was prepared by EPA for the Red River/Fargo Table Top Exercise. An attached file containing the report has been sent with these minutes.
- 6. Water Security Congress Greg Wavra attended this conference held in Washington D.C., September 27-29, 2010. Additional agencies with representatives at this conference were the EPA, the Federal Emergency Management Agency and the Emergency Management Assistance Compact (EMAC). Topics covered included: vehicles to support WARN; Recovery & Reimbursement Initiatives; Tools; Utiligent (Mass

Communication System Specializing in Water, Gas & Electric); Preparing to Respond; EMAC & WARN; Making the Business Case and Discussion onFuture Needs

New Business

- 1. Rain For Rent Joshua Wolla gave a briefing on his company's capabilities as an emergency response resource for ND WARN. Greg Wavra will work with him to further develop this partnership.
- 2. Election of Officers Nominations will be presented at the next meeting.
- 3. Next Meeting the meeting will be called following response to legislative action sometime in November. This will allow preparation before the North Dakota Legislature convenes. An alternate meeting date during the North Dakota Water Users Conference the first week in December was also discussed if November fills up before a response is received.






