#### **Clean Water State Revolving Fund Awards Three Loans**

BISMARCK, N.D. – The Clean Water State Revolving Fund (CWSRF) Program awarded loans to three cities in North Dakota between February and May 2017.

- Cavalier \$906,000 to extend sewer services to the Pines Subdivision. This project qualifies for loan forgiveness of \$271,800; the net amount of the loan will be \$634,200 when fully funded.
- Jamestown \$4,800,000 to develop an additional sanitary landfill cell.
- Larimore \$9,360,000 to replace 6.2 miles of sewer lines and construct storm-water control projects to reduce flooding and infiltration into the sanitary sewer system. This project qualifies for \$380,700 of loan forgiveness; the net amount of the loan will be \$8,979,200 when fully funded.

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency provides part of the funding for the CWSRF Program, which offers below-market interest rate loans to political subdivisions for financing projects authorized under the Clean Water Act. CWSRF programs operate nationwide to provide the funding necessary to maintain and improve the infrastructure that protects our valuable water resources.

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#### NDWPCC JOINT BOARD MEETING MINUTES

January 18, 2017 Bismarck, ND

A meeting of the Joint Board of Directors of the North Dakota Water and Pollution Control Conference (NDWPCC); North Dakota Water Environment Association (NDWEA); North Dakota Chapter of the American Public Works Association (NDCAPWA); North Dakota Section of the American Water Works Association (NDAWWA); and the North Dakota Chapter of the North American Stormwater and Erosion Control Association (NASECA-ND) was held on January 18, 2017 in the Cannon Room of the Ramkota Hotel, Bismarck, ND. The following board members and guests were present: Chuck Abel, Mike Berg, Mike Brisben, David Bruschwein, Tracy Eslinger, Bill Gefroh, Eric Gilbertson, Rick Gillund, Fred Goetz, Kellen Grubb, Harvey Gullicks, Marty Haroldson, Dale Heglund, Jeff Heintz, Wade Hesch, Barry Johnson, Wei Lin, Jennifer Malloy, Lance Meyer, Tim Paustian, Mark Peterson, Mike Quamme, Karl Rockeman, Jake Schafer, Gregg Stewart, Deon Stockert, William Sukalski, Jess Wagner, Don Wald, Greg Wavra, Adam Zach, and Gary Zuroff.

The meeting was called to order at 10:34 a.m.by NDWPCC President Joe Ferguson. Copies of the meeting agenda and 2016 NDWPCC financial report were provided to those in attendance.

The first order of business President Ferguson called for a motion to dispense with the reading of the minutes from the October 11, 2016, joint board meeting and October 13, 2016, business meeting in Minot, and approve the minutes mailed to all board members. Rick Gillund so moved, Tracy Eslinger seconded, and the motion carried.

Next, President Ferguson called for the Treasurer's Report. Mike Brisben read the 2016 NDWPCC financial report, which showed a net profit of \$25,444.15 and total assets of \$145,842.20. President Ferguson asked for any discussion. Hearing none, President Ferguson called for a motion to approve the Treasurer's Report. Lance Meyer so moved, Chuck Abel seconded, and the motion carried. Next, President Ferguson called for a report from the Auditing Committee. Gary Zuroff stated that the 2016 NDWPCC Financial Report and records were reviewed prior to the joint board meeting and that NDWPCC finances were in good order.

Continuing with old business, President Ferguson asked for an update on the Indesign Software upgrade for the Official Bulletin. Mr. Brisben noted that final expenditures were \$2,755.63. Jake Schafer also noted the upgrade was working smoothly.

Next, President Ferguson called for a report on the 2016 Conference. Mr. Brisben reported that 445 people registered and 416 were able to attend; there were 69 vendors who reserved 78 booths; 23 sponsors donated \$4,650 for the golf tournament, social hour, and coffee breaks; and 13 sponsors donated \$4,100 to help offset the \$6,000 fee for the Deuces Wild/Dueling Piano's entertainment. Meals served were as follows: Tuesday lunch 201, Tuesday buffet 216, Wednesday breakfast 317, Wednesday lunch 261, Wednesday banquet 246, and Thursday lunch 172.

President Ferguson asked for any other old business. Fred Goetz noted that accommodations by the Holiday Inn were lacking. Gary Zuroff commented that snacks and coffee for the breaks could have been better. Further discussion ensued with Mr. Brisben noting that change in ownership, staff turnover and the first time using the Holiday Inn may have contributed.

Discussion regarding the entertainment noted that attendance was lower than expected and that consideration for similar events should include moving the times back or moving the entertainment to after the banquet on Wednesday night.

Next, President Ferguson requested that the joint boards provide topics and presenters for the 2017 Conference by the next joint board meeting May 17, 2017. Next, President Ferguson called for a report on the 2017 Water and Wastewater Operator Training Program. Mr. Brisben indicated that 1,240 announcements had been mailed and he listed the dates for the upcoming sessions.

President Ferguson called for any other new business. Hearing none, President Ferguson called for a motion to adjourn. Mike Berg so moved, Wade Hesch seconded, and the motion carried.

The meeting adjourned at 11:04 a.m. NDCAPWA can be thanked for the refreshments and noon luncheon.

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#### NDWEA MEETING MINUTES

October 13, 2016 Minot, ND

The North Dakota Water Environment Association (NDWEA) held its annual business meeting on Thursday, October 13, 2016 at the Holiday Inn in Minot North Dakota. President Gary Zuroff called the meeting to order, 172 people were present at the 12:00 p.m. business luncheon.

The 2015 NDWEA annual meeting minutes were published in the Official Bulletin. President Zuroff asked if there were any objections to dispensing with the reading of the minutes. There were no objections. Karla Olson made a motion to dispense with the reading and approval of the minutes as published. Rick Gillund seconded the motion and the motion passed.

Bill Gefroh was called upon by President Zuroff to present the Secretary-Treasurer's report. As of August 16, 2016 the NDWEA has a general fund balance of \$12,407.56. In 2015 at this time the balance was \$11,699.03. The NDWEA membership is at 124, last year at this time it was 134. Seth Lynne made a motion to approve the Treasurer's report. Wei Lin seconded the motion and the motion passed.

President Zuroff called upon Wei Lin from the Nomination Committee, to present the NDWEA nominations. The Nominating Committee members were Wei Lin, Jessica Wagner and Karl Rockeman. Mr. Lin reported for the open officer positions, the Nomination Committee has one nomination for the NDWEA Vice President Don Wald and one for Professional Wastewater Operations Bill Sukalski. There were no nominations from the floor. Karla Olson moved that the nominations be closed and a unanimous ballot be cast for the nominated slate of announced officers. Seth Lynne seconded the motion and the motion passed.

At this time, President Michael Quamme became the Chief Officer of the NDWEA. President Michael Quamme presented Gary Zuroff with the President's Service Award. With no further business Mr. Quamme asked for a motion to adjourn. Don Tucker made a motion to adjourn. Seth Lynne seconded the motion and Mr. Quamme adjourned the meeting.

Dr. Lynn Broaddus a member of the 2015-2016 Board of Trustees for the Water Environment Federation (WEF) did a short presentation at the conference banquet. She spoke about WEF's strategic initiative to encourage innovation and continuous improvement in the water sector, in 2016 in partnership with the National Association of Clean Water Agencies, Water Environment Research Foundation, and Water Reuse and with support from US EPA launched the Water Utility of the Future Recognition Program (UOTF). The UOTF Today Recognition Program encourages the adoption of UOTF principles (water reuse, watershed stewardship, beneficial biosolids reuse, community partnering and engagement, energy efficiency, energy generation and recovery, and nutrient and materials recovery) as the "Organizational Culture of the Future" enables participants across a broad range of capacities and capabilities to collaborate, learn, and continue to evolve as a unified sector.

The UOTF concept was first introduced in 2013 to guide utilities of all sizes toward smarter, more efficient operations and a progression to full resource recovery with enhanced productivity, sustainability, and resiliency. At WEFTEC 2016, 61 utilities from across the globe received recognition. It should be noted that small utilities like Fond du Lac, Wisconsin were among the awardees. Recipients receive a flag that can be flown back at home for all to see.

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MINUTES OF THE FIRST ANNUAL MEETING OF THE WATER POLLUTION CONTROL SECTION OF THE NORTH DAKOTA WATER AND SEWAGE WORKS CONFERENCE Bismarck, North Dakota, October 7, 1960

The Water Pollution Control Section of the North Dakota Water and Sewage Works Conference held its First Annual Meeting at the Memorial Building in Bismarck, North Dakota, about 8:30 a.m., following a Section breakfast. The meeting opened with a discussion of events that had led to the formation of a Water Pollution Control Section within the Conference.

About two years ago, South Dakota indicated that they desired to establish their own Section within their Conference rather than have the Dakota Section (North and South Dakota) which was affiliated with the Federation. South Dakota made this change last year and at the 1959 North Dakota Water and Sewage Works Conference convention, the Conference, in their business session, decided to take no action until more Federation members could be obtained. At the Conference Directors Meeting on February 11, 1960, it was moved that adequate Federation members within the Conference had been obtained and that the State Health Department should draw up a constitution and by-laws, as recommended by the Federation, and submit it to the National Office, along with an application for affiliation, for their consideration and approval. This was done and approval of affiliation by the Federation was obtained.

The following slate of officers was elected: Kenneth Ruby, President; Johnny Klingenberg, Vice President; Norman L. Peterson, Secretary-Treasurer; and Norman L. Peterson, Director to the Federation Board of Control. The term of director will terminate in two years, as Peterson had served as director in 1960 on a tentative appointment by the Conference's Board of Directors.

The constitution and by-laws were discussed and approved by the members of the Section.


The next annual meeting of the Section will be held in conjunction with the next North Dakota Water and Sewage Works Conference annual meeting in 1961.

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


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#### 57th ANNUAL WATER AND WASTEWATER OPERATOR TRAINING PROGRAM by Craig Bartholomay ND Department of Health

This past February, March and April, the North Dakota Department of Health, the North Dakota Water and Pollution Control Conference, the North Dakota Section of the American Water Works Association, the North Dakota Chapter of the American Public Works Association, and the North Dakota Water Environment Association sponsored the 57<sup>th</sup> Annual Water and Wastewater Operator Training Program.

There were six sessions offered with a total of 339 attendants.\* Water treatment and distribution classes were offered February 27, 28 March 1, March 6-8, March 20-22, and March 27-29. Wastewater treatment and collection classes were offered April 10-12, and April 17-19.

The objectives for these classes are to fulfill the continuing education credit (CEC) requirement for certified operators, to hear presentations regarding regulations and how to avoid mistakes that can lead to noncompliance, to learn general operation and maintenance topics, and to give operators an opportunity to write a certification exam. The courses are not geared specifically to prepare operators for certification exams.

During the training classes, there were six operator examination sessions scheduled. These were reserved for the last day of each session. The Department administered 215 examinations this year, with a passage rate of 73%.

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#### New Department of Environmental Quality Created

During the 2017 legislative session, lawmakers passed Senate Bill 2327 establishing a new North Dakota Department of Environmental Quality (NDDEQ). The NDDEQ will continue to administer and enforce the same environmental protection programs as the existing Environmental Health Section of the North Dakota Department of Health.

Senate Bill 2327 allows just over two years for the Environmental Health Section to transition to the NDDEQ. By July 1, 2019, the new agency must have obtained all necessary approvals, revised rules as necessary, and ensured that primacy agreements with the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency remain in place.


A new 13-member Environmental Review Advisory Board will provide input to the NDDEQ regarding department policy and new regulations. The director of the NDDEQ will be a cabinet-level position appointed by the governor, and this individual will serve as the executive secretary of the board. The existing Air Quality Advisory Board and the Water Pollution Control Advisory Board will be consolidated, and additional members will be appointed. Ex officio board members are the state engineer, state geologist, and the director of the North Dakota Game and Fish Department. An individual with an agronomy or soil sciences degree will be appointed as well as representatives from each of the following:

ï County or municipal government

ï Manufacturing or agricultural processing industry

- ï Solid fuels industry
- ï Liquid and gas fuels industry
- ï Crop agriculture
- ï Waste management industry
- ï Thermal electric generators industry
- ï Environmental sciences
- ï Livestock industry

While the new NDDEQ may be organized differently than the existing Environmental Health Section of the Department of Health, the services and programs provided will stay the same. No new programs are proposed, nor or any current programs eliminated as a result of this transition. The primary changes will be the name of the agency and its new stand-alone status. Public meetings are planned to offer North Dakotans the opportunity to provide comment during this transition period. Public input will help guide development of the new North Dakota Department of Environmental Quality, with the goal of promoting efficiency, transparency and responsiveness as the agency works to protect the state's natural resources.



Mitch is also a member of the National Groundwater Association, the South Dakota Association of Environmental Professionals,


and the South Dakota Water & Wastewater Association. He holds a MS and BS in geological engineering from the South Dakota School of Mines & Technology.
